LANGUAGE CENTRE ILL STU

The Centre of Language offers modules/courses for all those from abroad who are interested in:

- working, or who already work and live in Slovakia and need to communicate in their workplace;
- learning to communicate in the Slovak language;
- studying in the Slovak language at one of the faculties of the Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava;
- completing their knowledge of other technical subjects.

The students who want to study in Slovak language at the elected faculty of STU are designed:

Module SLOVAK LANGUAGE A (MSLA)

(50 hours, level A1 – 175 €; 50 hours, level A2 – 175 €)

The graduate will acquire four language skills at the required (Basic A) level, i.e., reading comprehension, listening comprehension, basic oral and written communication of everyday life.

Module SLOVAK LANGUAGE B (MSJB)

(120 hours B1 – 420 €; 120 hours B2 – 420 €)

The graduate will acquire four language skills at the required (Medium B) level, i.e., reading comprehension, listening comprehension, the required oral and written communication skills. He/she can orient himself/herself in everyday situations, use common vocabulary, describe his/her activities. He/she can make small talks at unofficial and official levels.

Module SLOVAK LANGUAGE A1 – B1 (MSL)

(640 hours 2240 €, – winter semester 320 hours, summer semester 320 hours).

The graduate will acquire four language skills at the required (advanced) level, i.e., reading comprehension, listening comprehension, basic oral and written communication on everyday topics by means of instructional materials contained in the respective lessons of textbooks, and basic technical terminology of technical fields of study. He/she can independently communicate, describe everyday activities, orient himself/herself in time and space, express past actions, complete a questionnaire, write his/her CV.

Module INTENSIVE SLOVAK LANGUAGE A1 – B2 (MISL)

(1000 hours 3500 € – winter semester 500 hours, summer semester 500 hours).

The graduate will acquire 4 language skills at the desired (advanced - B2) level, i.e. reading comprehension, listening comprehension, oral and written communication of everyday life through the learning material contained in the lessons of the textbooks concerned. They are well versed in all common and specific situations. Their views and attitudes can be clearly defended and argued. He/she can spontaneously converse in society at an unofficial and even official level. He/she has knowledge of Slovakia; he/she knows about it at a middle level. The graduate's profile corresponds to the ability to understand complex texts on specific and abstract themes, and in the field of their own specialization to understand also professional discussions. It has the ability to spontaneously and fluently communicate at a normal speaking level with a partner for whom the language is a native language. It has the ability to have a clear and detailed expression on various topics, expressing its own opinion on topical issues and defining the advantages and disadvantages of different options. After successful completion of the Module Intensive Slovak Language and vocational training for foreign students at STU, the student will be able to continue studying in Slovak language at the selected faculty of STU, if she meets fulfils the conditions of the admission procedure in accordance with the Act No.131/2002 Coll. on universities and on the amendment and amendment of some laws.

ORGANIZATION OF TEACHING

Teaching takes place in the morning, or in the afternoon, a study group consists of 6 to 12 people. Teachers are specialized in teaching Slovak as a foreign language.

METHODS

Lectures (interpretation of theory), demonstration forms (samples of interpreted subject matter at concrete examples, samples of subjects), teamwork (dialogues, situational games), self-study, individual study.

TECHNICAL EQUIPMENT, TEACHING AIDS

Modern air-conditioned classrooms in the city centre. Work desks, PC, overhead projectors, screens, VCR, study texts in print, CD, online, data projector.

FINAL ASSESSMENT - final test (with a success rate above 60%) and controlled interview.

The condition is the minimum number of course participants 7 persons, maximal 14.



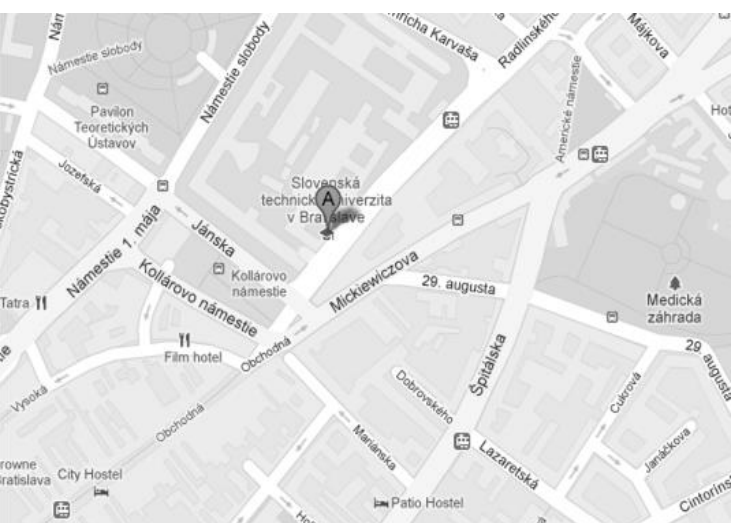
DISTANCE FROM STU
