The Rector of the Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava (hereinafter referred to as “STU” or “University”) in line with Section 92 of the Act No. 131/2002 Coll. on Universities and on Amendments and Supplements to Certain Acts, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the “Act”), and in line with the Article 39 of the internal regulation No. 2/2023 Statute of the Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava, as amended, herewith

applicable to study programmes ensured by faculties of STU and the Institute of Management of STU (hereinafter referred to as the “Directive”). The tuition and fees associated with studies shall be, in the case of faculties of STU, determined based on a proposal of the relevant faculty Dean, and in the case of the Institute of Management of STU, based on a proposal of the Director of the Institute of Management of STU.

Article 1

**Basic Provisions**

(1) The studies in study programmes of the first, second and third level shall be realised at a faculty, if professionally and organisationally ensured by the faculty; in other cases, the study programme shall be realised at the University (Institute of Management of STU). Unless otherwise stipulated in a specific provision of this Directive, the term “faculty” shall also apply to the University (Institute of Management of STU) and the term “Dean” shall apply in connection with the University (Institute of Management of STU) to “Rector”; all terms shall be in relevant relationship to the meaning of the affected provision, unless they contradict with the nature of the given provision.

(2) The basis for determining the tuition and fees associated with studies at the university and its faculties shall be 10 % of the average amount connected to one student in full-time studies of the overall usual expenditures provided by the Ministry of Education, Research, Development and Youth of the Slovak Republic (hereinafter referred to as the “Ministry”) to public universities from the state budget as part of the specification of the approved budget in the previous calendar year. The

basis shall be rounded down to whole five euro<sup>1</sup>.

(3) The basis, pursuant to Clause (2) of this Article set by the Ministry, for the academic year 2026/2027 shall represent the amount of **EUR 780.00**.

(4) The annual tuition shall apply to the academic year.

(5) The annual tuition in study programmes in the **full-time form of studies** must not exceed five times the basis, pursuant to Clause 2 of this Article. Limitation of the tuition amount shall not apply to tuition in the study programmes in the full-time form of studies in other than state language, pursuant to Article 2 Clauses (7) to (10) hereof.

(6) Annual tuition in study programmes in the part-time form of studies must not exceed the result of multiplication of the amount of the maximum annual tuition determined by the Ministry for the relevant academic year by a measure [ Article 3 Clause (1) hereof] and the quotient expressed as a result of division of the number of credits, the achievement of which serves as a pre-requisite for proper completion of studies in the relevant study programme, and the result of multiplication of standard length of studies of the relevant study programme and the number 60<sup>2</sup>. The maximum annual tuition in study programmes in the full-time form of studies shall be derived from the subsidy for the realisation of accredited study programmes<sup>3</sup>.

(7) For the purposes of this Directive, the first three years of studies in study programmes in line with Section 53 par. 3 of the Act (joint first and second level of studies) are considered to be first level study programmes, and the fourth and any further years of studies in a study programme, in line with Section 53 par. 3 of the Act, are studies in a second level study programme in such a way that the fourth year of studies in a study programme in line with Section 53, par. 3 of the Act is considered as the first year of studies in a second level study programme, and further years accordingly<sup>4</sup>.

(8) A study programme realised in the state language shall mean a study programme realised in the Slovak language or in a combination of the Slovak language with another language, resp. languages (e.g. Czech language, English language), which means that the study programme (as a whole) is not realised exclusively in a language other than the state language.

(9) In the case of a student studying on the basis of an interstate or international agreement, the tuition and study-related fees are governed by the provisions of this agreement. If the interstate or international agreement does not regulate the conditions for the payment of tuition or if it states the tuition to be paid in accordance with the regulations of the receiving state, the obligation to pay tuition does not arise if the student is provided with a scholarship from funds from the state budget.<sup>5</sup>

(10) A student that is studying in the Slovak Republic as part of an academic mobility in accordance with §58 (a) of the Act, through an exchange program created with the approval of the government or as part of a programme of the European Union for education and professional training, youth and sport, or a student that has been granted asylum, temporary refuge or supplementary protection is not obliged to pay scholarship fees.<sup>5</sup>

(11) A student that is granted a scholarship through a scholarship programme created with the approval of the government is not obliged to pay scholarship fees<sup>5</sup>.

(12) The provisions of this Directive governing the manner of delivery shall follow the provisions of Act No. 305/2013 Coll. on Exercising the Powers of Public Authorities in Electronic Form (The E-Government Act), as amended, governing electronic official communication.

Article 2

**Tuition in the Full-time Form of Studies**

(1) The annual tuition in the full-time form of studies for the academic year 2026/2027, pursuant to Article 1 Clause (5) hereof, must not exceed the amount of **EUR 3 900**.

(2) A student in the full-time form of studies shall be obliged to pay annual tuition to the faculty, if such obligation applies to him or her, pursuant to Clause (3), (5), (8), (9) or (10) of this Article.

(3) A student who **studies concurrently**, during one academic year, in two or more study programmes provided by a public university or state university with a seat in the territory of the Slovak Republic (hereinafter referred to as the “university”) on the same level, shall be obliged to pay annual tuition in the second and further study programme for studies in the academic year 2026/2027. A student, who re-registered for studies in another study programme on the relevant level, after an interruption of studies, shall be obliged to pay to the university a proportion of the annual tuition, depending on the number of calendar months remaining until the end of the academic year 2026/2027, following their re-registration<sup>6</sup>.

(4) A student, pursuant to Clause (3) of this Article, shall have the right to decide in which study programme they will study in the academic year 2026/2027 free of charge, if they are entitled to free university studies<sup>7</sup>. The student shall be obliged to notify about this decision the study department of the faculty at which they are registered, namely no later than **by 30 September 2026**<sup>8</sup>.

(5) A student who **studies** in a study programme provided by the faculty **longer than its standard length of study**, shall be obliged to pay to the faculty tuition for each further year of studies; if student studies a degree programme longer than their standard length of study due to participation in an academic mobility under an exchange program and the terms of that exchange programme or the student was awarded by a social scholarship in the last year of their study during standard length of study, the obligation for payment of tuition fees in accordance with the first sentence of this point does not arise in the year of study following the year of exceeding the standard length of study. The total length of studies reflects the period for which the student was registered at a university in one of the study programmes of relevant level of university education; if the student is registered, during one academic year, for parallel studies in several study programmes, only one year shall be calculated in the overall length of study. Tuition fees due to studies longer than the standard length of study of the relevant study programme shall be determined as a proportional part of the annual tuition fee depending on the number of credits that should be obtained by the student in the relevant academic year in relation to the student's standard load<sup>9</sup>.

(6) The overall period of studies, pursuant to Clause (5) of this Article, shall not reflect the period during which the student was registered for studies at a university in a study programme in which he or she paid tuition.

(7) A student of a study programme in the full-time form of study is obliged to pay the annual tuition fee in each academic year if the study programme (as a whole) is **conducted exclusively in a language other than the state language (hereinafter referred to as “foreign language”)**. The obligation to pay tuition fees arises only if

- a) in the academic year in which the student began to study the relevant study programme, any higher education institution accepted students for studies in the same field of study and degree in a study programme which is also conducted in the state language [Clause (1) point 9 of this Directive], and
- b) the faculty has informed the admitted student about the obligation to pay the tuition fee in writing, together with the amount of the annual tuition fee for all years of study during the standard length of study of the study programme.<sup>10</sup>

(8) A student in full-time study according to Clause 7 of this Article shall pay annual tuition each academic year **during the standard length of study** of the study programme, in the amount determined by the directive for the academic year in which they were accepted for study, for study programmes realized exclusively in a foreign language. The faculty may reduce the published tuition fees during the course of study.<sup>13</sup>

(9) A student in full-time study according to Clause 7 of this Article is obliged to pay the annual tuition fee in the amount determined for the given study programme for the relevant academic year, for study programmes realized exclusively in a foreign language, **after exceeding the standard length of study**<sup>11</sup>.

(10) Tuition in a study programme that is conducted exclusively in a foreign language shall be paid in accordance with the regulations effective until 24 April 2022, if the student enrolled in the relevant study programme until 24 April 2022<sup>12</sup>.

(11) The faculty may decide if it requires tuition for a study programme conducted exclusively in a foreign language. In the case that the faculty will not require tuition for such a study programme, the accepted applicant will not be notified of the obligation to pay tuition fees in accordance with Clause 7 (b) of this Article. In such a case, a student of a study programme in full-time form, conducted exclusively in a foreign language will only pay tuition if such an obligation arises in accordance with Clause 3 or Clause 5 of this Article.

(12) The annual tuition for the academic year 2026/2027, in the full-time form of studies in the study programmes offered at individual faculties and at the University (Institute of Management of STU), shall be stated in **Annex No. 1** hereof.

### Article 3

#### Tuition in the Part-time Form of Studies

(1) The Decree of the Ministry setting forth the amount of maximum annual tuition for the academic year for part-time form of study programmes taught at public universities and state universities is available at the following website: <http://www.minedu.sk/opatrenia/>.

(2) A student, in the part-time form of studies, shall be obliged to pay the annual tuition in each year of studies<sup>13</sup>.

(3) A student, in the part-time form of studies, shall pay each year **during the standard length of studies in the study programme**, the amount of annual tuition determined **by the directive for the academic year in which their studies started**<sup>14</sup>. The provision of the first sentence of this Clause applies to a student in the part-time form of study who was admitted to study in the particular academic year and also to a student whose study of the study program started in the particular

academic year due to a change in the study program. The faculty can reduce the published tuition in the course of studies.

(4) A student in the part-time form of studies, **after exceeding the standard length of studies**, shall be obliged to pay annual tuition in the amount determined for the part-time study programme for the relevant academic year<sup>15</sup>.

(5) The annual tuition in the part-time form of studies in the study programmes realised at individual faculties and at the University (Institute of Management of STU) shall be stated **in Annex No. 1** hereof.

#### Article 4

#### **Form of Payment and Due Date of Tuition**

(1) The Act No. 71/1967 Coll. on Administrative Proceedings (Administrative Procedure Code), as amended, shall not apply to the proceedings and decision concerning the obligation to pay tuition.

(2) A student shall be obliged, pursuant to the valid Study Regulations of STU, to correctly state facts decisive for the determination of tuition, in form of a declaration that is to be submitted by the student at the time of the first registration for studies and at each subsequent registration for further parts of the study programme, through the Academic Information System (hereafter referred to as "AIS").

(3) After the obligation to pay tuition arises, based on matters mentioned in Clause (2) of this Article, the faculty shall be obliged to issue to the student a written decision on the amount of tuition (hereinafter referred to as "the decision on the obligation to pay the tuition"). The decision on the obligation to pay the tuition shall contain a statement indicating the amount of tuition and the due date of the tuition, justification of the obligation to pay the tuition and instruction on the possibility of submitting an application for a reduction or remission of tuition fees (hereinafter also referred to as the "Tuition Adjustment Application" or "Application"). A decision on the obligation to pay the tuition shall be delivered to the student's own hands.

(4) The student shall be obliged to pay tuition no later than within **10 business days** from the day of the delivery of the decision concerning the obligation to pay tuition<sup>15</sup>. Tuition is paid by a cashless transfer to the bank account of the faculty, registered at the State Treasury, bank account number and variable symbol are stated in the decision on the obligation to pay the tuition. The day the sum of money enters the faculty bank account, per the previous sentence of this point, is considered the day of payment of tuition.

(5) If not provided otherwise, in justified cases, the student may submit a written Tuition Adjustment Application, pursuant to Clause (3) of this Article, to the Rector; submitting the Application does not have a suspensory effect on the validity and enforceability of the Decision on the Obligation to Pay the Tuition. The student shall submit the Tuition Adjustment Application through AIS, print it out and personally sign and deliver it to the relevant study department or send it via regular post to the address of the relevant study department, no later than within a period of **10 business days** from the day of delivery of the decision on the obligation to pay the tuition. In case of Applications sent by regular postal mail, the date of their submission marked by the post office on the envelope shall be decisive. This means that this date cannot be later than the tenth business day after the delivery of the decision on the obligation to pay the tuition. The study department shall forward collectively

Applications of students to the Rector, together with opinions of the faculty Dean/Director of the Institute of Management of STU concerning individual Applications.

(6) The Rector may reduce or remit tuition and fees associated with studies, depending on the study results, social and health situation of the student or other circumstances being worthy of special consideration, pursuant to principles stated in the Statute of STU<sup>16</sup> and in cases stated in Article (5) of this Directive. The rector **shall not allow postponement of the due date** of payable tuition.

(7) The Rector shall issue a decision in the matter of Clause (6) of this Article within a period of 30 days from the delivery of Tuition Adjustment Application to the Rector through relevant study department of the STU.

(8) An application submitted pursuant to Clause (5) of this Article, but delivered after the lapse of the deadline for its submission, pursuant to Clause (5) of this Article, shall not be considered.

(9) Actions of a student, who refused to provide information and facts decisive for the determination of the payment of tuition and fees associated with studies or who stated incorrect or incomplete information or failed to pay tuition and fees associated with studies in a proper and timely manner, shall be considered as a disciplinary offence in line with the valid Disciplinary Rules of STU for Students. STU shall claim unsettled debts in court<sup>17</sup>.

#### Article 5

#### **Reduction or Remission of Tuition by the Rector**

(1) If it is not stated otherwise the Rector shall not approve a reduction or remission of tuition in case of an obligation to pay tuition due to parallel studies [Article 2 Clause (3) hereof], studies in the full-time form exclusively in a foreign language [Article 2 Clauses (7) to (10) hereof] and part-time studies [Article 3 hereof].

(2) The Rector can **reduce tuition for exceeding the standard length of studies** [Article 2 Clause (5) hereof] in the following cases and in the following scope:

a) Social and health situation of the student:

1. If the student is a half-orphan, under the condition that they continue to be entitled to the payment of orphan's benefits; in such a case, **tuition can be reduced by 50%**;
2. If the student, in the academic year preceding the academic year in which the obligation to pay tuition originated, suffered an unexpected life event preventing him or her to pay tuition in the full amount (e.g., natural disaster); in such a case, **tuition can be reduced by 50%**;
3. If the student suffered serious deterioration in health condition, which affect their study duties (work disability longer than 1 month), during studies of the study programme, which was the reason for exceeding the standard length of studies under the study programme in such a case, **tuition can be reduced by 50%**.

b) Other circumstances:

If a student achieved a weighted study average (hereinafter referred to as the “WSA”) of no more than 1.5, and at the same time was an important sportsman or sportswoman (representing the Slovak Republic at World or European Championships, Olympic Games, World Universiade) in the academic year preceding the academic year in which the obligation to pay tuition arose; in such a case, tuition can be reduced by 50%.

(3) Reasons for reducing tuition, stated in Clause (2) hereof, cannot be mutually cumulated. The Rector shall always consider only the most serious reason stated in the Application of a student.

(4) The Rector can **remit tuition for exceeding the standard length of studies** [Article 2 Clause (5) hereof] in the following cases:

- a) Social and health situation of the student:
  1. If the student is an orphan, provided they continue to be entitled to the payment of orphan’s benefits;
  2. In case of a student with specific needs<sup>18</sup>, who exceeded the standard length of studies, due to his or her disability,
  3. In case of a student that was granted a scholarship of the Slovak government, during the standard length of study, as a part of development cooperation under a special regulation<sup>19</sup>.
- b) Other circumstances:
  1. If the student exceeded the standard length of studies, due to changes in the study programme as a result of terminated accreditation (revocation) of the original study programme at the STU;
  2. If the student achieved WSA of no more than 1.2, and at the same time was an important sportsman or sportswoman (representing the Slovak Republic at world or European championships, the Olympic games, world Universiade) in the academic year preceding the academic year in which the obligation to pay tuition originated;
  3. If the student of the study programme of the third level has fulfilled all conditions for graduating from the studies, except from the defence of the dissertation paper which he or she has turned in during the standard length of studies of the study programme;
  4. If the student, whose obligation to pay tuition originated, abandoned studies within 45 days from the start of the relevant academic year.<sup>20</sup>

(5) The Rector shall remit tuition of a student due to exceeding the standard length of study (Article 2 Clause (5) of this Directive) in the first academic year of such exceeding, if the obligation to pay tuition has arisen due to pregnancy or persistent care of a child younger than three years of age, or a child with a health disability younger than five years of age.

(6) The Rector can remit tuition to the student who has the obligation to pay tuition for study exclusively in a foreign language pursuant to Article 2 Clauses (7) to (10) of this Directive, if at the same time in the relevant academic year he was awarded a special scholarship to support foreign students, which is repeatedly or regularly provided to the student in the scope of social support pursuant to the valid Scholarship Regulations of STU.

(7) The Rector can remit or reduce tuition of a student, if it is result of an agreement between STU and other university or other legal entity; in this case it is possible to remit or reduce tuition to the amount specified in the relevant agreement.

(8) The Rector can remit or reduce tuition fees of students who have changed their study programme within STU and who were obliged to pay tuition fees for their original study programme in the academic year 2026/2027 (hereinafter referred to as the “original obligation to pay tuition fees”). Tuition fees in view of this Clause shall be remitted or reduced only for those students who have performed the original obligation to pay tuition fees (including a decision on a decrease in tuition fees pursuant to this Article) and for those students who have been released from their original obligation to pay tuition fees by the Rector using the procedure pursuant to this Article.

(9) The Rector can remit tuition fees of students who have the obligation to pay tuition for exceeding the standard length of study (Article 2 Clause (5) of this Directive), if the students changed the study programme within STU and were not obliged to pay tuition fees for the original study programme in the academic year 2026/2027 pursuant to the Article 2 Clause (5) of this Directive due to participation in an academic mobility under an exchange program and its terms or the students were awarded by a social scholarship in the last year of their studies of the original study programme during standard length of studies.

(10) The Rector can remit or reduce tuition based on other factors of special consideration.

(11) The Application for Adjustment of Tuition needs to be accompanied by documents credibly proving the student’s reason for its submission, namely:

- a) Confirmation of representation at world or European championships or Olympic games or the world Universiade;
- b) Medical confirmation from a specialised doctor proving serious and long-term medical issues;
- c) Doctor’s confirmation of pregnancy;
- d) Sworn statement regarding a personal and persistent care of a child younger than three years of age, or a child with a health disability younger than five years of age
- e) A document confirming the lasting title to the payment of orphans’ benefits;
- f) A relevant document that the situation (unpredictable life event) occurred, within the meaning of Clause (2) a) Sub-clause 2 of this Article;
- g) Or any other relevant documents associated with the reason stated in the Application;

#### Article 6

#### **Fee for Material Arrangement of the Admission Procedure**

(1) The faculty shall ask the applicants for studies to pay a fee for material arrangement of the admission procedure, which is another condition of being accepted for studies<sup>21</sup>.

(2) The fee has been derived from the actual costs of faculty associated with actions connected to the admission procedure. Its amount must not exceed 25% of the basis, pursuant to Article 1 Clause (3) hereof<sup>22</sup>. For the academic year 2026/2027, the fee for material arrangement of the admission procedure must not exceed **EUR 195**.

(3) The fee for material arrangement of the admission procedure shall be paid in advance, and its payment shall be proven by attaching the document, confirming the payment, to the application for studies, but this does not apply in the case of payment of the fee for material arrangement of the admission procedure through the electronic application in AIS<sup>23</sup>.

(4) The Rector shall not allow for reduction, remission or rescheduling of the due date of the fee for material arrangement of the admission procedure.

(5) The amount of fees for material arrangement of the admission procedure at individual faculties and at the University (Institute of Management of STU) for students admitted to studies in the academic year 2026/2027 is stated **in Annex No. 2** hereof.

## Article 7

### Fees Connected to Studies

(1) The University or the faculty can request<sup>24</sup> fees for issuing documents about studies and their copies<sup>25</sup> and for issuing copies of documents about graduation from studies<sup>26</sup>, administrative fees for recognition of documents, which are considered an income of the state budget, and for acknowledging the equivalence of documents about studies under a special Regulation<sup>27</sup>. The amount of the fee shall be derived from the actual costs of the University or faculty connected with these activities.

#### (2) Fees for issuing documents about studies

(7) Costs related with sending of certificates and other documents stated in this Article via the postal service, if they are not included in amount of costs, shall be charged according to the current pricelist for postal services.

## Article 8 Final Provisions

(1) Any amendments and supplements hereto can be made only based on numbered amendments hereto, issued by the Rector; in case of tuition fees for study programmes provided by the faculty at the proposal of the relevant Dean and in case of tuition fees for study programmes provided by the University (Institute of Management of STU) at the proposal of the Director of the Institute of Management of STU. The Rector is authorized, after an amendment to this Directive is issued, to issue a complete wording of this Directive as well.

(2) The following annexes shall be an inseparable part hereof:

- a) **Annex No. 1:** Annual tuition for study programmes in full-time form and part-time form of studies offered at individual faculties and university (Institute of Management of STU), in accordance with Articles 2 and 3 of this Directive
- b) **Annex No. 2:** Fees for the material arrangement of the admissions procedure for applicants in the academic year 2026/2027, in accordance with Article 6 of this Directive.

(3) This Directive shall enter into force on the date it is issued.

(4) If it is not stated otherwise, this Directive shall become effective on the date September 1, 2026.

(5) For the purposes of the rights and obligations of applicants for study at the STU in accordance with Art. 6 of this Directive if they relate to the academic year 2026/2027, this Directive shall take effect on October 1, 2025.
