

## TOP-UP TO THE BASIC Erasmus+ GRANT

An Erasmus+ mobility participant is entitled to the following top-ups a-e. Top-ups in c to e cannot be combined, a participant can only receive one of these increases.

- **a. Green travel**: green travel is the use of environmentally friendly means of transport. A student or graduate can receive this grant on a one-off basis when using the following types of transport:
  - train,
  - bus,
  - bicycle,
  - any other type of long-distance public transport except air transport and passenger car transport.

The top-up will be granted based on a declaration on oath submitted at least one month before the mobility and travel documents submitted after the mobility. In case the student fails to submit travel documents after the mobility, he/she is obliged to return the amount of the top-up to STU.

- **b. Support to overcome economic and social disadvantages:** this top-up will be granted to the student in the following cases:
  - 1. the student is a **recipient of a social scholarship**. The student must provide evidence of the decision of receiving the social scholarship in the academic year.
  - 2. the student is a **single parent**. The student must provide the child's birth certificate and a declaration on oath stating that he/she is a single parent at least one month before going on mobility.
  - 3. the student comes from a **low-income family**. The student must provide proof of having received material hardship benefits for at least one month in the 12 months preceding the mobility for at least one parent; or proof from the competent Labor, Social Affairs and Family Office that at least one parent is long-term unemployed at leastone month before the mobility.
  - 4. the student is a migrant or refugee and belongs to a low-income family. The student must provide a document proving the granting of asylum in the territory of the Slovak Republic according to a special regulation; or a document proving the granting of subsidiary protection in the territory of the Slovak Republic according to a special regulation; or another document proving this fact according to generally binding legislation. At the same time, he/she must provide



one of the documents confirming the status of a student from a family with low income referred to in point 3 at the latest one month before going on mobility.

- 5. a student with other disadvantages or fewer opportunities. The student must provide a written justification of the situation and a declaration on oath at least one month before going on mobility. These cases will be considered on a case-by-case basis based on the facts stated in the justification.
- d. support for students with specific needs: a student with a specific need is defined as a student with a sensory impairment, upper or lower limb impairment, chronic illness, medical impairment, mental illness, autism or other developmental and/or learning disabilities. This increase will be granted to the student based on the submission of a decision of the Dean of the faculty concerned on the classification as a student with specific needs, issued in the academic year in which the student applies for mobility, at the latest one month before the mobility.
- **e. support for students with severe disabilities (severely disabled):** a severely disabled person is defined as a natural person whose functional impairment is at least 50 %. The increase will be granted to the student upon presentation of a disability card at the latest one month before the mobility.
