

COVID-19 Useful Information

Information on high-risk countries

The list of the low-risk countries has been changed from September 1, 2020. The following countries have been removed from the list: Belgium, France, Croatia, Netherlands, Malta, Spain. They are now considered as high-risk countries.

All the countries that are **NOT** listed in the list of low-risk countries are considered as high-risk countries. The current information about the countries and entry measures are provided by the Public Health Authority of the Slovak Republic:

Coming to Slovakia

Foreigners (including EU citizens) who have visited a country **NOT** listed as a low-risk country (except for the Slovak Republic) within the period of the last 14 days, may enter the Slovak Republic through the internal borders of the Slovak Republic with the Czech Republic, Republic of Austria, Republic of Poland and Hungary, as well as air borders (border crossing points located at the airports on the territory of the Slovak Republic) **provided that they comply with the quarantine measures of the Public Health Authority (they remain in self-isolation until they receive the negative RT-PCR test result for COVID-19 done in the Slovak Republic).**

If you have visited a high-risk country within the period of the last 14 days, you **MUST register in the state system COVID PASS:**

Protective measures

There are some easy protective measures that can slow down the spread of the coronavirus and other transmitted diseases:

- washing or disinfecting hands regularly
- wearing a protective mask that cover both your nose and mouth in indoor places (**it is MANDATORY in all the public transport and shops**)
- avoid shaking hands and close contact with large public groups
- using a paper tissue when coughing or sneezing
- stay home when you feel unwell and contact your doctor in case of symptoms (e.g. fever, cough, difficulty breathing)
